In pursuance to a call issued by Comrades Joseph H. Stines, Isidor Isaac, Isaac Eckstein, Jastrow Alexander, Jacob Jacobs, Joseph Unger^{and}, Joseph C. Wolff, a meeting of Union Veterans of the late war who are of the Jewish Faith was held on Sunday March 15th at the Lexington Avenue Opera House. The meeting was called to order by Comrade Isidor Isaac who stated the objects of the call and on Motion

Comrade Jastrow Alexander was elected Temporary Chairman and Comrade Isidor Isaac, Temporary Secretary. On Roll-call, 63 Comrades answered to their names. After speeches by several Comrades, who spoke in favor of perfecting a permanent organization, on motion a Committee of seven (7) was appointed to select permanent officers, the Committee consisting of Comrades Adam Brown, Jos. C. Wolff, Louis Block, Gustav Arnold, Leopold Enoch, Isaac Kohn and Jacob Jacobs, retired, and on its return presented its report and recommended that the following named Comrades be selected as the officers of the Association.

A regular meeting of the Hebrew Union Veterans Association was held on Sunday, Oct. 4th, at Grand Opera House Hall, Col. Jos. H. Stines presiding.

68 Comrades answered to their names. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. In the absence of the Treasurer - Master, Joseph Unger, Col. Stines appointed Comrade Moritz Sterenberg to act as Trs. Master for this meeting. The Adjutant reported that since our last meeting, one of our Comrades, Max Altschul, had died. Lt. Col. Eckstein reported that in the absence of the Colonel, he took charge of the funeral services, and that the Comrade had received a soldier's burial. On motion, the Adjutant was directed to send a letter of condolence to the family of the deceased Comrade, and the same to be spread on the minutes. On motion, a bill of \$6. for carriage hire for the funeral of the deceased Comrade, was ordered paid.

A regular meeting of the Hebrew Union Veterans Association was held on Sunday, Nov. 7, at Grand Opera House Hall, Col. Jos. S. timer presiding. Enroll-call of Officers, all were present with exception of Maj. Jastrow Alexander. On motion, the roll-call of members was dispensed with. The Adjutant's report of the preceding meeting was read and approved. A communication from Mrs. Altschul widow of our late Comrade, Max Altschul, was read thanking the Comrades of this Association for their kindness to her in her hour of bereavement.

consisting of Comrades Eckstein, Adamsky and Sless. The Committee retired, and on their return reported favorable on all the candidates with the exception of Jacob Gluckauf, which they recommended to lay over till the next meeting, for further investigation. On motion, the report of the Committee was adopted, and Jacob Bacherheiser, Martin Stambert, and Henry Loewenthal were elected to membership in this Association.

The Adjutant reported the death of Comrade Moritz David, of Co. C. 7th Regt. N. Y. Vol. who died on Monday Oct. 26, 1896, and was buried on Wednesday Oct. 28, and that on account of short notice, it was impossible to notify the Comrades, but that an advertisement had been inserted in the N. Y. Herald, Lieut. Stiner and Lt. Col. Eckstein reported that the last honors to our departed Comrade, were given at Koltzes Post.

Headquarters and at the grave. On motion, the Adjutant was directed to forward a set of Resolutions to the family of our deceased Comrade.

The Adjutant tendered his

resignation; The same was not accepted, but laid over indefinitely.

A regular meeting of the Hebrew Union Veterans' Association, was held on Sunday, Dec. 6th, 1896, at the Eighth Judicial Dist. Court Room, Col. Joseph H. Steiner presiding. On roll-call of Officers, all present with the exception of Maj. Alexander. Roll-call of members was dispensed with. The Adjutant's report of the previous meeting was read and adopted.

A communication was received from Mrs. Isidore Strumpfack for assistance. It was laid on the table. The Adjutant reported that Comrade Leopold Masius had reported sick, and that the following comrades had been appointed on the Sick Committee:— Adam Brown, Jacob Bacharach, Adolph Bargebuhl, Louis Block and Davis Bennett. Comrades Bargebuhl and Block reported that they had visited the Comrade and found him sick. The other 3 Comrades did not report.

The Committee on Entertainment reported progress. Comrade Adam Brown, Chairman of the Committee, requested the Comrades to be diligent in the sale of tickets, and turn the money for same in as soon as possible. The following Comrades were appointed a committee to escort the remains of our deceased Comrade, Samuel Eckstein, to its resting place. Lehman Josephson, Jacob Jacobs, Alexander Falk, Israel Cohn, Louis Block, S. Simon Henry Levy and Isidore Isaacs, and in accordance with the By-Laws, two carriages were ordered for

the use of said committee. Col. Joseph H. Steiner requested that all Comrades who could do so, be present at the funeral services of our departed Comrade. About 30 Comrades volunteered to be present.

A motion was made and carried that every Comrade inform the Adjutant if he had a place of burial in case of death.

A motion was made and carried that in case of too short a notice for the Adjutant to send out notices for the death of any comrade, the same would be published in the N. Y. World and N. Y. Staats-Zeitung. A motion was made and carried that the Tr. Master's bond be \$500. in two securities of \$250. each.

The Quarter-Master's report was then read; Bills were rendered for \$7.75 printing, and \$.50 for Crape. On motion, the same was ordered paid.
