LIECHTENSTEIN: Prince Johann ruled this sovereign state until his death in 1929. It is about 65 miles square; bounded on the right bank by the Rhine River, a few miles above Lake Constance. This country lies between Austria and Switzerland, and is more Austrian than Swiss. Its population does not exceed 11,500 people! It has one small railway. No army! No navy! Most of its inhabitants are engaged in farming. There are, however, a few manufacturing plants, such as cotton goods, leather and pottery. The language spoken is German.

Liechtenstein has been independent since 1866; have their own constitution; until 1919 was closely allied with Austria; adopted Swiss currency in 1921. Switzerland administers its telegraph and post service. Yes, it has a distinctive postage stamp. What a fine peaceful little government! And, mind you, only fifteen men constitute the management of its governmental affairs!

Authority on Righteousness

How different is the situation in Germany today. In the late war, thousands of Jewish veterans born in Germany, fought for the fatherland. Thousands made the supreme sacrifice and many returned to their homes wounded and feeble. What expression of thanks, however, are they getting today from Hitler and the Nazi administration. Regardless of whether a Jew was born in Germany, and regardless of the fact that he was a soldier who fought for Germany in the World War, he has suddenly become what might be termed an outcast and an untouchable, without any justifiable reason either in the eyes of God or man.

I am one of those who believe that those responsible for the institution of German persecution were insane persons. The record shows that many of them were moral perverts and that Hitler had surrounded himself with innumerable individuals with sadistic inclinations. I read in the newspapers only a few weeks ago that even from the tombstones over the graves of the dead Jewish soldiers, inscriptions indicating who they were and with whom they served were ruthlessly ripped off. All this shows the brutal and uncontrolled hate of the Nazi rulers inflamed by their bitter desire to crush and put an end to any evidence of the fact that there were thousands of Jews in Germany who died that that nation might be preserved.

The domination of the world by the force of the Nazi is the ambition of Hitler and his entire regime. In his land, therefore, and under his administration, hatred and bigotry and persecution prevail. Men and women are no longer human beings with the right to think and to act in the manner God Almighty intended. The Nazis deserve no cooperation whatsoever from America, and particularly from American sportsmen. To me it is inconceivable how any lover of American institutions and of fair play, can even suggest for a moment that we should send our boys and our girls in 1936 to compete in the Olympic Games, if held in Berlin.

The Olympic Games were instituted for the purpose of promoting and encouraging fair play and brotherly love. It was thought that international competitions might cause the nations the better to know one another. The Nazis are forgetful of all this and instead they revel in injustice and persecution and hate and bigotry. These are the only things that the Nazi administrators seem to be familiar with.

In December, 1933, the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States, of which I have the honor of being President, passed a resolution to the effect that it would oppose America's participation if there was evidence of persecution of the Jews. If that resolution was justified then, it is clearly justified now.

I am happy to have done something to crystalize American sentiment against America's participation. The battle today is a difficult one, but so confident am I, that the cause has the better of the moral issue, I shall continue to fight to the bitter end.

It is a great consolation to know that the Jewish War Veterans are with me in this struggle, because their support will be at all times helpful and most inspiring.
