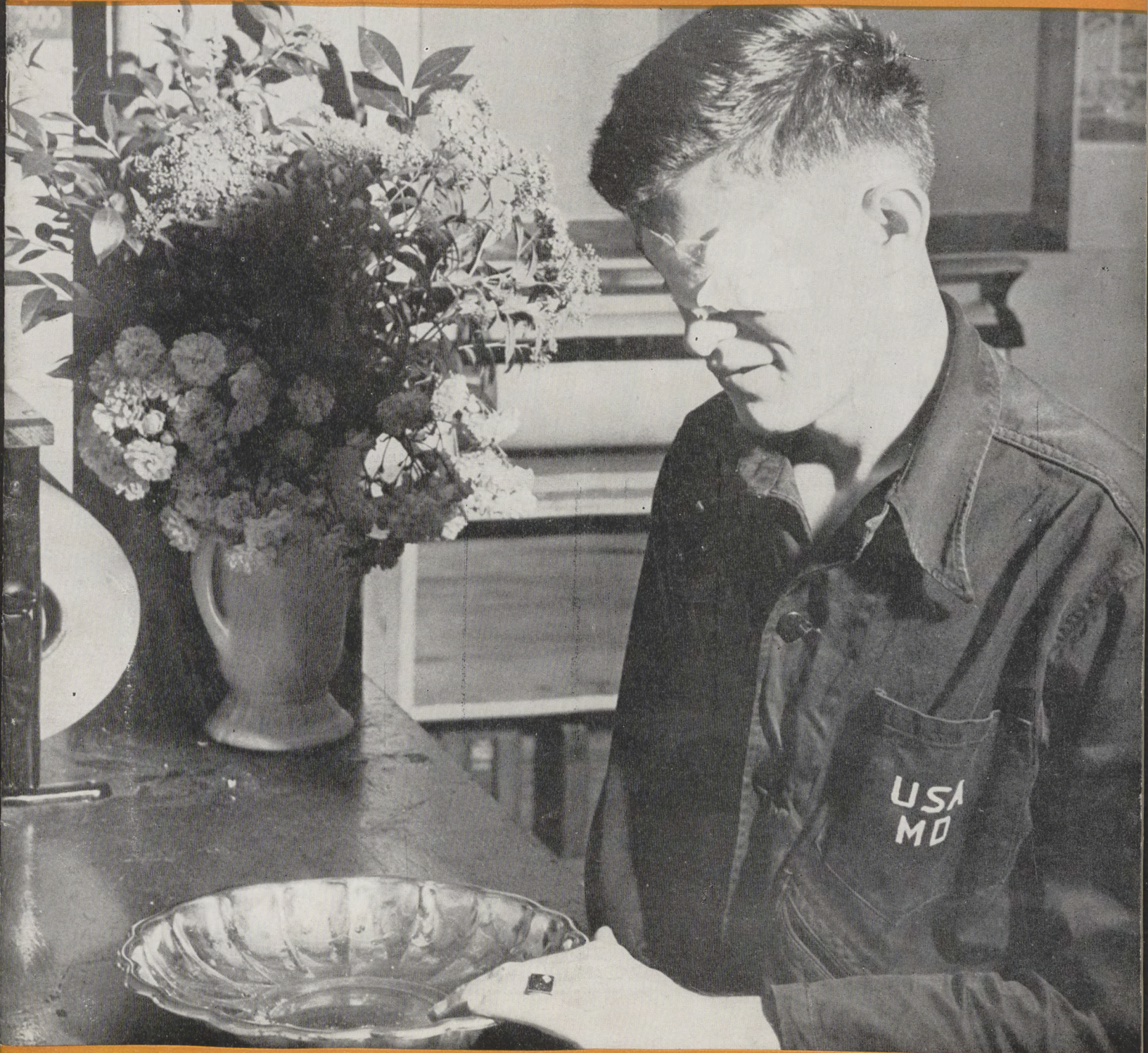

THE NEW YEAR

ON the occasion of the High Holy Days, I extend to my comrades in the Jewish War Veterans, to my fellow Jews everywhere, my sincere wishes for a year of happiness and achievement and progress.

I feel, moreover, that our prayers for the new year must also be accompanied by our stern resolutions to help make the world, in the year ahead, closer to our hearts' desire. It is for us to decide how much of ourselves we can give to bring about a world in which all men can live in greater happiness and security. The share of each one of us may be infinitesimal. We must contribute it none-the-less.

And so again I ask that we all join in resolutions for the year ahead:

That we resolve to carry our full and responsible burden as members of the world family, as citizens of the United States, as Jews.

That we resolve to be on guard against all those who would assault the democratic values that we hold dear.

That we resolve to give profound thought to our problems in all fields of human endeavor; to be on guard against the propagandist and the sloganeer; to be determined to think through the problems and the proposals offered for their solution.

That we resolve, moreover, to recognize the indissoluble bonds between all men of all lands, all races and all creeds; that we act truly by the concept that a hurt to our fellow men is a hurt to us.

That we resolve to play our conscientious role as citizens by careful study of the issues, by faithful participation as voters, and by steady communication with our elected representatives.

That we resolve to give generously of our funds to those the world over who are so desperately in need; to Jews who have been the particular victims of the tragedies of recent years and to all men who have been brought low.

That we resolve to bring to the organizations and associations with which we are affiliated the strength of our moral, financial and intellectual resources; that we take our memberships seriously; that we *do* as well as *join*.

I urge these resolutions upon my comrades in JWV—upon all who read these lines.
