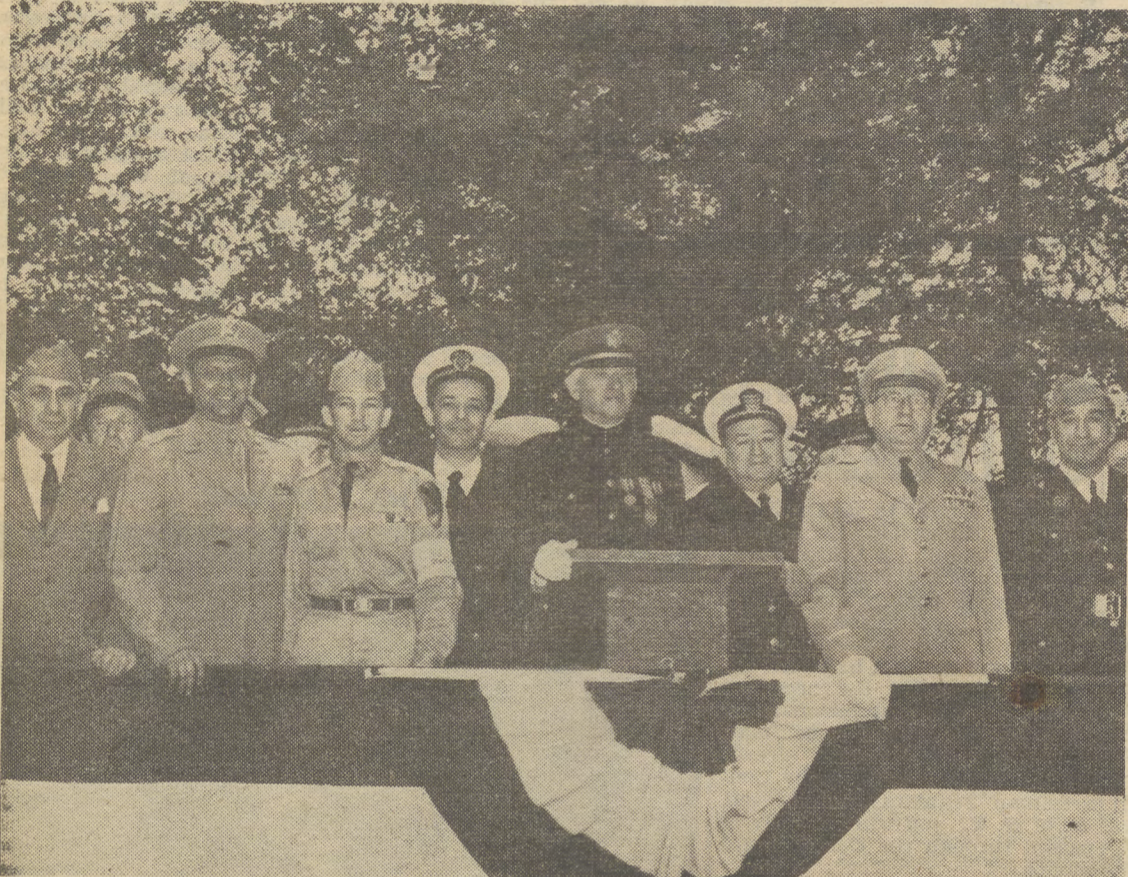

## CALLS U. S. TARGET 1 IN REDS DRIVE FOR WORLD DOMINATION

"The American people are beginning to appreciate the magnitude of the Communist threat to this country, but relatively few are conscious of the immediacy of this danger, Henry Albert, National Commander, told the Department of Massachusetts assembled in Boston for the recent department convention.

Commander Albert warned that U. S. security is additionally menaced by a revived German Nazism, "which has already demonstrated its eagerness to resume its war against the free world by allying itself with the Communist regime of eastern Germany and by encouraging a rise in extreme nationalist sentiment in the west German state."

He asserted that "the United States is target number one in the Communist drive for world domination; for in defeating the principal arsenal and granary of democracy, Communism stands to gain nothing less than the world."

He described Korea as the "scene of communism's first assault on its priority target, for that is where the lives of Chinese peasants are being expended by the hundreds of thousands in an all-out effort to bleed the United States physically and economically."

Mr. Albert contended that the suicidal fanaticism of Chinese Communist troops "represents one of the tragic costs of years of Congressional insistence on pinching pennies from budget requests for overseas information

programs to fight the Communist Big Lie in Asia."

To safeguard the United States against totalitarian conquest the National Commander urged that we follow a program of complete preparedness on both military and civil defense measures rather than rely on the "dangerous notion that our atomic weapons stockpile is adequate to defend this country against any sudden un-announced Communist attack. He also called for stepped-up efforts by the community, the state and the nation to eliminate the inequalities and injustices that breed the frustration and discontent in which Communism and other forms of political extremism are likely to take root."

The National Commander called for vigorous surveillance by the United States and her allies on neo-Nazi trends in western Germany. Calling attention to recent public opinion samplings in that country which showed 70 to 90 per cent of the population in opposition to re-armament of any kind. He declared that "the only real appetite for re-arming in western Germany is being manifested by the former Nazi military professionals and ex officials of the Nazi party, who constitute the least reliable allies in defending the security of the free community of western nations against Communist aggression."

The only sound defense against Communist ambition in Europe, he held, is the speedy development of a strong, unified western Europe defense force, backed by "a willingness on the part of the free world to face up to the responsibilities that must be met and the sacrifices that must be made by every free man to preserve human liberty against the encroachments of the most monstrous tyranny of all history."

Commander Albert also announced that JWV will conduct a seminar in Boston on July 8, to examine organizational and propaganda techniques employed by Communism on both the domestic and foreign scenes. The program will function under the direction of the JWV commission created recently to coordinate the efforts of the entire organization throughout the country in exposing and combatting Communist activities. PNC Frederick Harris of Meriden, Conn., is chairman of the commission.

Mr. Albert also announced that Governor Paul A. Dever of Massachusetts and Mayor John B. Hynes of Boston have accepted invitations to act as honorary chairmen of the seminar.

## WARNS OF NEW PHONY PEACE RALLY

Warning JWV members in the State of Illinois to be on their guard against the forthcoming "American People's Congress and Exposition for Peace", which the Communist Party is planning to conduct in Chicago, June 29, 30 and July 1, PNC Frederick Harris of Meriden, Conn., chairman of JWV's Commission for the exposure and combatting of Communist and subversive movements, dispatched a letter to Illinois Department commander Theodore Pickard urging him to issue a public statement for the organization indicating JWV's awareness to this latest successor to the infamous "American Peace Crusade" which did not fare too well in this country after it had been identified as the U. S. phase of the world-wide Communist "peace offensive".

Calling this latest move by the Communist party another in their "long line of attempts to confuse and mislead the American people and obscure the truth about Korea", Mr. Harris told Commander Pickard that a much more appropriate place than Chicago for the affair might be the capital of the Soviet Union. "For it is in Moscow that the real key to peace in Korea can be found providing only that Communist leadership can summon up an honest will to reach a peaceful settlement on a basis of justice and respect for the rights of nations and peoples to determine their own political destiny."
