## Fun for Delegates Set for Convention

MILWAUKEE, WISCONSIN—On the entertainment agenda for the 61st National Convention here are numerous activities that are sure to score a big hit.

Starting off the good times will be the Early Bird Affair on Tuesday, August 7. A series of acts will be presented on the Amateur Night program at Hotel Schroeder, beginning at 9 p. m.

To date a good array of acts have submitted their entries and a variety of entertainment is assured. Some of the performers are solos representing various Posts, Auxiliaries and Departments throughout the U. S.—while others are group presentations which will prove hilarious.

The local JWV Posts and Auxiliaries will be among those providing acts. Admission will be free to registered delegates.

Wednesday's entertainment will be highlighted by the "Bigtime Showtime" presentation at midnight at the Wisconsin Theater, across the street from Hotel Schroeder.

Convention Corporation officers have not divulged the identity of the headliner, but they have promised one that will present a show they'll never forget.

It has been announced that numerous acts—from Milwaukee and Chicago TV, radio and night club circles—have been signed up and they in themselves comprise an outstanding vaudeville show. JWVs will receive their tickets to this affair when they register.

Another top entertainment attraction is scheduled Thursday, when the convention visitors will attend the Milwaukee Braves-St. Louis Cardinals baseball game at Milwaukee County Stadium.

Both of these teams are top contenders in the National League pennant race and will meet in a game starting at 8 p. m. in the Braves park, which is the newest baseball plant in the world today.

It has been the scene of record-breaking attendance for the past three years and with the Braves playing as they are, another mark-shattering season is in the making.

The National Convention Corporation was fortunate in obtaining 1,000 tickets to the game and they will be distributed to register-

The entire fourth and fifth floors of Hotel Schroeder—which include numerous various-sized caucus rooms—plus special club rooms and parlors on the first, second and third floors have been assigned to JWV for the duration of the convention.

These areas are air-conditioned—and also will be the site for hospitality bars furnished free by the
