Comd'r Waldor Returns From Flying Visit With Officials And Troops In Vietnam

Brings Back Reports From Fighting Front

A flying visit to the Vietnamese battlefield by National Commander Milton A. Waldor and National Executive Director Monroe R. Sheinberg has dramatized to the nation the involvement of Jewish fighting men and the Jewish community in the anti-Communist struggle while eliciting expressions of appreciation from the highest levels of the U.S. Department of Defense.

The JWV leaders conveyed to Jewish and non-Jewish soldiers in Viet Nam the fact that the U.S. Jewish community at large and Jewish veterans of previous wars are solidly behind their heroic efforts. JWV proved through the visit that "the protests of noisy dissenters do not reflect the overwhelming sentiment of the American people," according to Commander Waldor.

The trip, which included visits to the Danang, Chulai, and

Meikong Delta battle zones, ensued from a unanimous resolution adopted at the National Convention in August, 1964. It was then resolved that JWV "supports U.S. commitment to Vietnamese independence and freedom as an integral link in the free world security system, and that JWV endorses the action of President Johnson in ordering the attack on the North Vietnamese 'hive' as the source of Communist assault... a necessary and proper response to irresponsible provocation."

Commander Waldor and Mr. Sheinberg, both decorated veterans of World War II, re-

Waldor Warnings Confirmed Red Advisors Arrive In Syria

Reliable reports that Red Chinese military advisors are arriving in Syria were cited by JWV National Commander Milton A. Waldor as confirmation of JWV warnings that Communist China is seeking to penetrate the Near East and foment an Arab "liberation war" against Israel.

Commander Waldor called attention to the arrival in Syria of 185 military experts and technicians to assist the Communist-equipped Syrian military forces. He noted that 415 more are on the way to Syria from Peiping under a new Syrian-Chinese agreement.

"It is obvious that Red China is trying to upstage Moscow in wooing Arab favor and wants to use Arab-Israel tensions as a springboard," said Commander Waldor.

He stressed that since Red China is exploiting the Arab-Israel conflict, "the United States should react immediately and affirmatively to bolster Israel's military potential to quickly crush any Chinese-Syrian aggression."

Commander Waldor pointed out that Red China would like nothing better than to create a

diversion in the Near East to escalate tensions in the Mediterranean area so that American forces will be tied down in reserve at N.A.T.O. bases and unable to answer reinforcement calls to Vietnam."

He suggested that closer ties be developed between the United States and Israel with a view to joint action against the Chinese infiltration schemes in the Near East.

The Jewish War Veterans warned several months ago against the trend now emerging and emphasized that Communist world infiltration tactics were interconnected.

Waldor Criticizes Proposal Of Nuclear Arms to Germany

A proposal that West Germany be equipped with longer-range weapons armed with American nuclear warheads was criticized by the National Policy Committee of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A., which met at the Washington Hilton Hotel on November 19th, 1965.

The Committee termed "extremely dangerous and counter-

The Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A. late this month urged visiting Chancellor Erhard of West Germany personally to intervene to reverse German economic measures recently taken at the expense of Jewish survivors of the Nazi holocaust.

In a sharply-worded telegram to the German Chancellor, care

Waldor Questions Embassy In Bonn On Part In Play

Critical questions about cooperation by the United States Embassy in Bonn with Germany in production of "Dallas—November 22nd," a play in "extremely bad taste about the assassination of President Kennedy," have been raised by the JWV.

National Commander Milton A. Waldor said the play by former Nazi screen writer, Felix Lutzendorf, who wrote Nazi propaganda screen plays, did not merit the cooperation of the American Embassy. The Embassy provided pictures of President Kennedy and U.S. Marine uniforms used in the play. Commander Waldor said the play amounted to "nothing more than a semi-glorification and a semi-justification of Lee Harvey Oswald by depicting the assassin as an intelligent idealist whose guilt must be shared by society in general." Though purporting to be based on the Warren Commission Report, the play "irresponsibly distorts personalities depicted, including Oswald and
