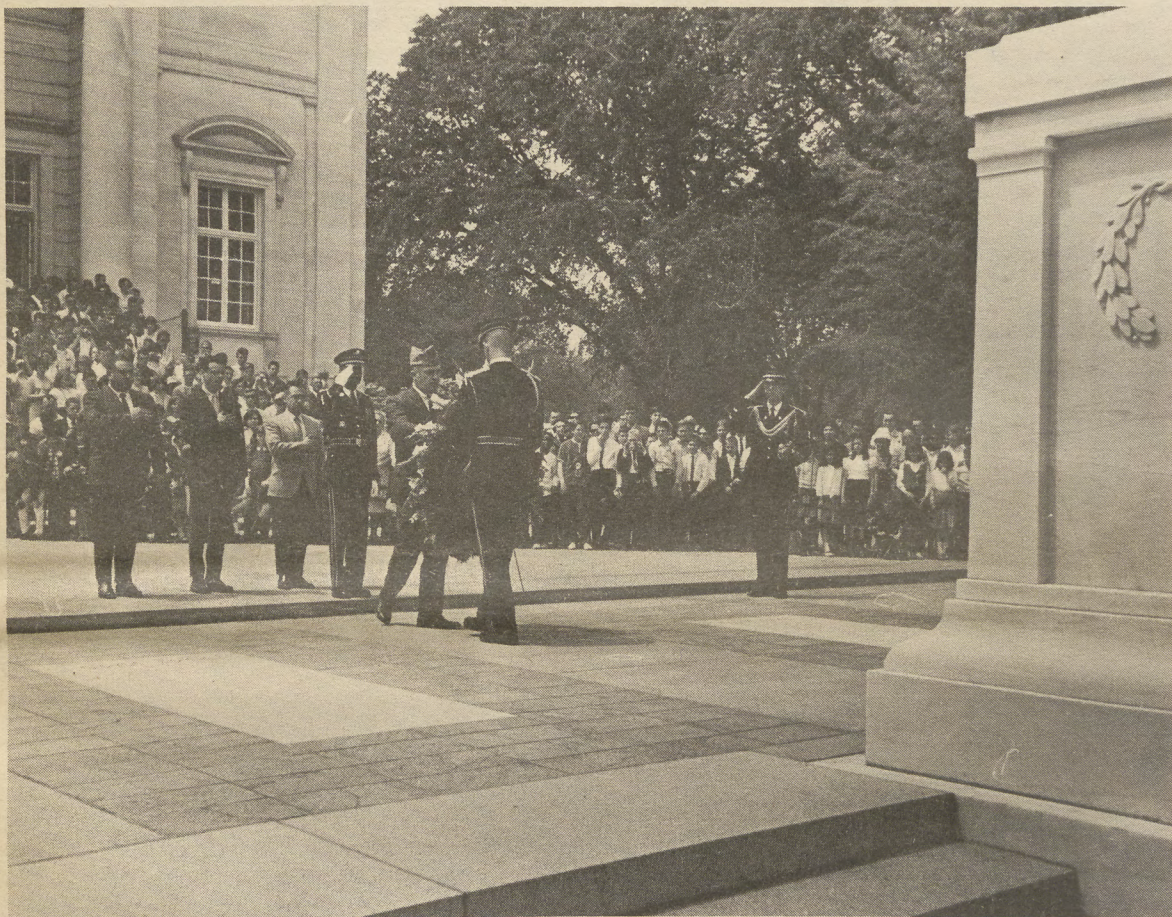

J WV Chief Warns Against Soviet Peacemaker Role

Vital American security throughout the world is at stake in Soviet Russia's thinly disguised role as "peacemaker" among dissident Arab nations, Milton A. Waldor, National Commander of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A. warned.

"There are strong indications that Soviet Russia, for its own militantly subversive and aggressive purposes which bode ill for world peace, has succeeded in overcoming the strong rivalry between Egypt and Syria and enlisting the two Arab states, along with others, in a Soviet-armed, Soviet-directed cabal aimed at the United States and the Free World and fundamentally against

Waldor Urges Speedy Action On Civil Rights Legislation

Immediate enactment of pending civil rights legislation "should be a top priority in view of the shooting of Negro civil rights leader James H. Meredith", according to National Commander Milton A. Waldor of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A.

Commander Waldor said that "if the recent White House Conference 'To Fulfill These Rights' is to have real meaning, Congress must act to deter trigger-happy bigots." He said that "fanatics in Mississippi and Alabama are aware that assassins of Negro and white civil rights workers have gone free after phony trials by prejudiced all-white juries."

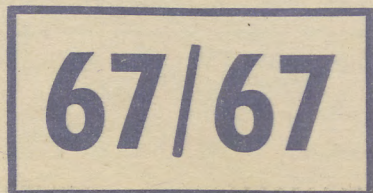
The J WV leader said "the time has come to enact the entire civil rights package. If the situation of unpunished crime goes unchecked, violence may beget violence and we will be in for a long,

hot summer that will make last year's Watts riot look like a Sunday school picnic."

He found it "obvious that local authorities in Mississippi are not punishing or inhibiting those who in the past by terror and murder sought to deny Negro citizens their right to vote, register voters, and other basic rights. That is why a bigot from Tennessee permitted himself to shoot Mr. Meredith—not in Tennessee but in Mississippi where crimes go unpunished if the victims are Negroes."

The J WV leader said that Pres-

Waldor Urges Aid Cut-Off To Arab States

Severance of all forms of American aid and loans to all Arab League states supporting the so-called "Palestine Liberation Organization" was asked this month by J WV National Commander Milton A. Waldor "in view of the announcement by the Palestine Liberation Organization that its members will be sent to Viet Nam to aid the Vietcong against the United States."

This aid means that American dollars are given to the Arabs only to turn up in Asia in the form of soldiers and bullets killing our American boys.

Commander Waldor said the announcement by Ahmed Shukairy, P.L.O. head, that Arab soldiers will "fight alongside the Vietcong in their struggle against American imperialism" requires an immediate American response. He said that such Arab involvement "would end the phony pose

The major veterans organizations of the United States were urged this month by the Jewish War Veterans to join in support for four key amendments to the Administration's Civil Rights Bill, which have been proposed by the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, a federation of more than 100 civil rights, labor, religious and civic organizations.

"We fought in the uniform of our country for democracy, equality of opportunity and the rights and dignity of all our citi-
