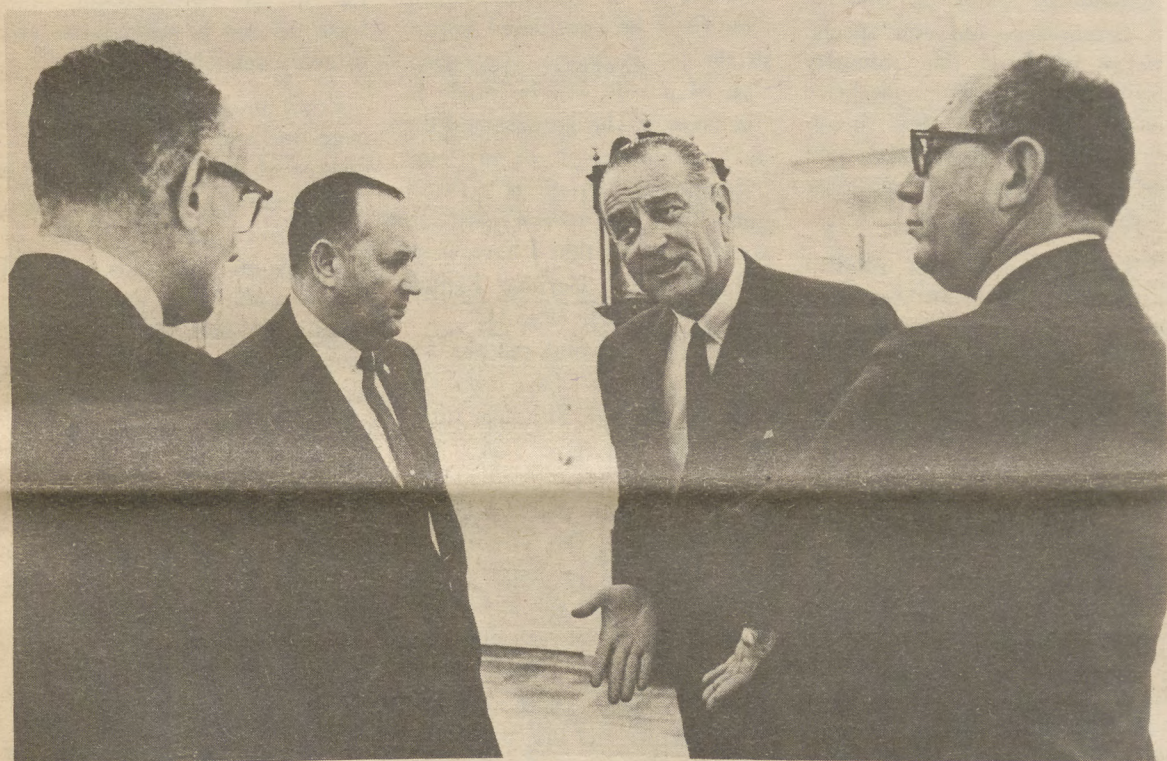

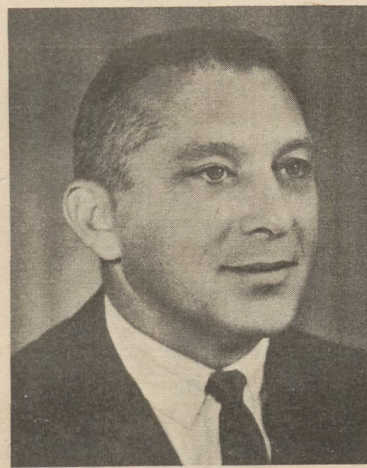

### JWV CHIEF COMMENDS STRONG ENFORCEMENT TO HALT EXTREMISTS

The "superb police work of New York officials" should be emulated by law-enforcement authorities throughout the nation in dealing with the "Minute Men" and other extremist groups, JWV National Commander Malcolm A. Tarlov said this month.

Commander Tarlov said "the existence of a private army" had long been deplored by his organization. He said steps should be taken against "similar extremist groups in various states, especially California where considerable activity of this type is known to exist."

The veteran leader said "it is urgent to maintain closer surveillance not only over this organ-

### Jewish Chaplains Endorse JWV Policy Executive Committee Issues Statement

JWV National Commander Malcolm A. Tarlov acknowledged with appreciation the October 24, 1966 statement of the Association of Jewish Chaplains, which fully supports the position of the Jewish War Veterans in connection with the recent conference between President Johnson and Jewish War Veterans leaders.

Commander Tarlov pointed out: The Association of Jewish Chaplains, a nation-wide group of rabbis with present or past service in the Military Chaplaincy, thoroughly investigated and studied the issue. They concluded that there was absolutely no substance or justification for the charge of some Jewish leaders that the Jewish War Veterans had acted improperly in reporting President Johnson's attitude

toward the Jewish community.

The Chaplains, after careful consideration, pointed out that unclear reporting of the entire

### Tarlov Exposes Soviet Intentions Instigating Strife in Near East

The time has come for the United States to challenge Soviet intentions in fomenting strife in the Near East, JWV National Commander Malcolm A. Tarlov told the organization's National Policy Committee meeting at the Marriott Motor Hotel in Philadelphia late last month.

Commander Tarlov cited reports that huge quantities of Soviet arms—rockets, jets, tanks, and guns—are being poured into

Syria at a time when that country has openly proclaimed intention to wage a "war of national liberation" against neighboring Israel. He said Soviet arms are also moving in large amounts to Egypt, Iraq, and Algeria.

The most immediate "flash-point of explosion," said the JWV Commander, is the tense Syrian-Israeli frontier where "day after day we see Commu-
