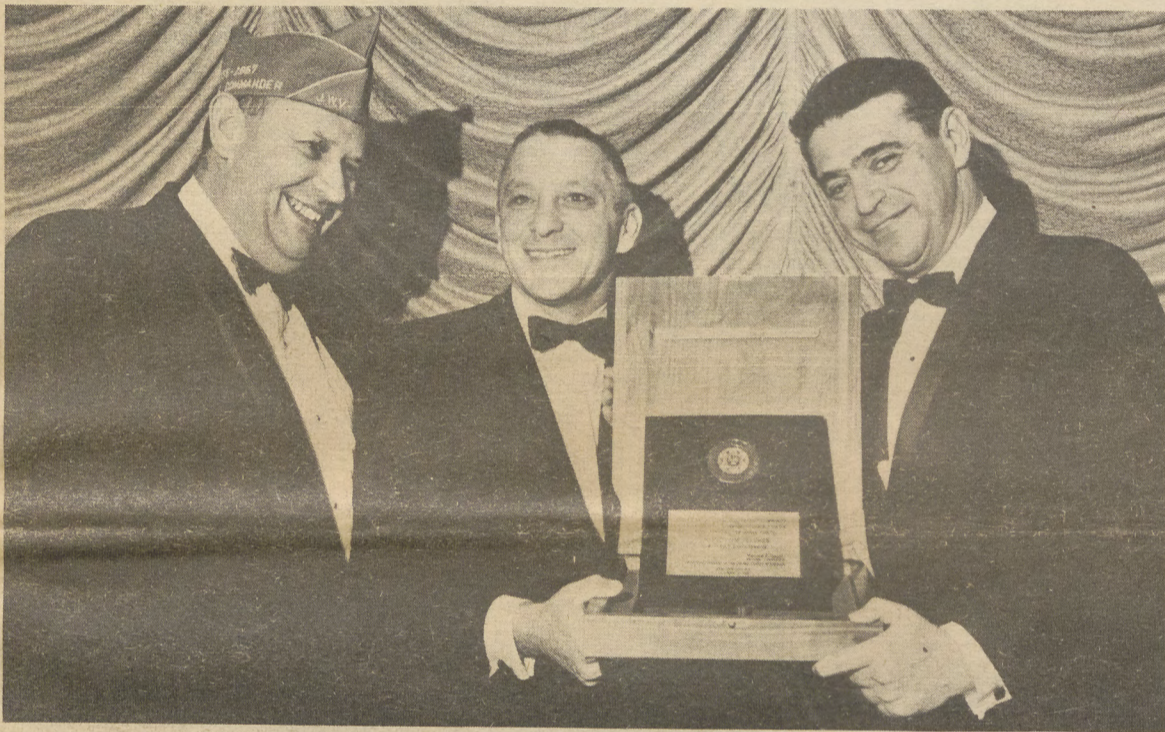

Tarlov Calls For Enforcement Ban Of Nazis In West Germany

The Jewish War Veterans last month called upon Germany's new Chancellor Kurt Georg Kiesinger to "show militancy and firmness against the rebirth of Nazism in Germany, and thereby initiate legislative action to ban neo-Nazi political parties."

In a cablegram dispatched from New York where delegates to JWV's National Executive Committee were holding meetings, the nation's oldest active war veterans' organization called on Kiesinger to "reassure the world of West Germany's sincerity in facing the challenge posed by the current resurgence of neo-Nazism".

The cablegram signed by National Commander Malcolm A. Tarlov pointed out that the banning of such parties was consistent with laws currently in effect in West Germany outlawing the Communist party and the Nazi Party per se.

Commander Tarlov warned

that his organization would continue to bring pressure to bear in the highest circles to prevent a reoccurrence of the events that led to the rise of Hitler and the extermination of 6,000,000 Jews.

JWV Warns Conflict In Mideast Could Spark World War III

The Jewish War Veterans last month warned that unchecked border incidents in the Middle East could be the catalyst that could ignite World War III.

Speaking to the National Executive Committee of the Jewish War Veterans, meeting in New York City Malcolm A. Tarlov, National Commander of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A., pointed out, "the basic cause of the tensions and conflicts in the Middle East is the continued murderous border incursions by Arab fanatics, constituting an ever present threat to peace."

"The further threat posed by placing Iraqi and Saudi Arabian troops in Jordan now makes the situation more critical than ever," he said.

"Imagine," said Commander Tarlov, "scores of American citizens along the border of the United States murdered by invaders from neighboring countries in thirteen separate attacks within a few weeks. Imagine, if you will, futile and unsuccessful appeals for cessation of such attacks directed by the United States to the governments of such neighboring countries and to the
