## JWV EXPOSES ARAB DIPLOMATS USE OF BLACK POWER EXTREMISTS

### JWV National Commander Samuels Urges Vigorous Federal Action

Vigorous Federal action against Arab diplomats who use Black Power extremists to foment anti-semitism in the United States has been urged by the Jewish War Veterans.

Comander Samuels speaking for the JWV said the evidence of collaboration by the Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) with the Arab Governments was such that an FBI investigation should be undertaken. He said that such an investigation could lead to declaration of offending Arab diplomats as persona non grata and their deportation for intervention in domestic American affairs. It might also establish "the subversive role of Black Power extremists who foment anti-semitism as agents of foreign governments."

A smashing campaign to force Black Power extremists to list themselves as foreign agents and to deport Arabs who abuse American hospitality was advocated by the Commander to stem the rising anti-Jewish tendencies emerging from racial tensions.

Samuels said, "The State Department recently indicated that it could act if evidence were found to incriminate the Arabs and SNCC." He said, "The Federal Government has vast investigative apparatus at its disposal, at home and abroad. The trip of Black Power fanatic Stokely Carmichael to Havana, Hanoi, Algiers, Cairo, and Damascus—in violation of U. S. passport laws—certainly merits investigation and appropriate action."

The Commander added that "the confession in the press by Ralph Featherstone, national program director of SNCC, that the source of SNCC anti-Jewish propaganda was the Arab embassies in Washington should have prompted more than a mere theoretical observation by the State Department."

He said "men are dying in Vietnam to combat the same ideology espoused by the Communists and their Black Power fellow-travelers. If we are fighting extremism and totalitarianism abroad, why do we not follow up consistently with firm action against attempts to divide and conquer within the United States?"

### JWV Outlines Policy Against Nazi Burials in U.S. Cemeteries

The views and recommendations of The Jewish War Veterans, regarding future burials of members of the American Nazi Party in National Cemeteries, was clearly stated in a recent exchange of letters between JWV's National Commander and the Offices of the Honorable Stanley Resor, Secretary of the Army.

Since the recent controversy and notoriety over the funeral arrangements of the late George Lincoln Rockwell brought home

to everyone the grave principles that were involved at even the idea of a member of the discredited Nazi Party being buried in one of our National Cemeteries, complete with regalia, swastikas, and Nazi services. Commander Samuels felt that the position of the JWV on this important subject should be plainly stated to the Dept. of the Army, and that also certain recommendations should be made in order to avoid such a bad-
