# news around the Jewish world

Americans by overwhelming majority are opposed to the U.S. providing either Egypt or Israel with nuclear reactors, according to latest Harris poll. The poll showed that providing reactors for Egypt was opposed by 69-17 per cent and to Israel by 66-21 per cent. Two-thirds of the public are afraid both countries would end up producing atomic bombs with nuclear capability furnished by U.S., according to Louis Harris, whose organization conducted the poll . . .

**DR. BERNHARD E. OSSON**, national director of Inter-religious Affairs for the National Conference of Christians and Jews, believes another holocaust is possible; says the last holocaust pointed out the failure of the church and contends anti-semitism is a continuing problem in America. . . . Israel's **MAJOR GENERAL AMOS HOREY** (ret.) is guest of honor of Washington chapter of the American Technion Society, Wednesday, Sept. 11 at the Washington Hilton. . . . **SENATOR HENRY M. JACKSON** (Dem.-Wash.) described as "in-

correct" Israeli radio report alleging that he had delivered a message from Chinese leader Chou En-Lai to Israeli officials saying Chinese people were interested in seeing Israel remain strong since that would provide a barrier to Soviet expansionism in the Middle East. On his return from Peking, Jackson said Chinese had not changed their position regarding Israel, although the Senator indicated he received impression the Chinese are not as anti-Israel as they seem. . . . **POPE PAUL VI** emphasized in letter his support for the Palestinians' "legitimate aspirations," his "heartfelt sharing of their sufferings," and the need for "effective collaboration between all relief organizations concerned with Palestine." Pope's sentiments were contained in a letter of "gratitude and exhortation" sent to Monsignor John Nolan, president of the pontifical commission for Palestine. . . . Newest Jewish periodical is fortnightly **JEWISH SPORTS REVIEW**, an on-going record of current Jewish achievements in all sports, edited and published as a labor of love by S. Wallman. . . . **JILL ST. JOHN**, Hollywood actress who was often romantically linked with Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, is

known to her Jewish parents as Jill Oppenheim. . . . Group of unidentified vandals desecrated the **JEWISH CEMETERY OF FEGERSHEIM** near Strasbourg, destroying nearly 80

graves. It is fourth attack on a Jewish cemetery in the region within the last two months. . . . **PRESIDENT NIXON** wanted his daughters to keep away from "the arts" during 1972 election campaign because people in them: "they're Jews, they're left-wing," according to transcripts of conversations he had with his Chief of Staff, H.R. Haldeman in Oval Room of White House June 23, 1972, six days after the Watergate break-in. . . . **PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION** (PLO) will open an office in Moscow. Communique in effect recognizes the PLO as the sole representative of the Palestinians. . . . Former Premier **GOLDA MEIR** has denied report by NBC-TV she met with King Hussein May 27. Mrs. Meir's denial referred only to time and place of reported meeting with Hussein. . . . **HOUSE FOREIGN AFFAIRS COMMITTEE** voted to boost economic support to Israel to \$250 million for the next fiscal year, which is \$200 million more than Nixon Administration asked. . . . Executive Council of the **AFL-CIO** has urged the U.S. government to provide "all

necessary assistance" to Israel. "Israel, the only viable democracy in the Middle East, faces economic problems possibly more threatening than the military attacks upon her by her neighbors," the Council said in a statement. . . . Amid sharp public protests, a Danish Nazi sympathizer has been named lecturer at the Aarhus University. **POUL HEINRICH RIIS-KNUDSEN**, who has never hidden his admiration for Hitler and the Third Reich, is due to begin teaching German literature and language at Aarhus Sept. 1.
