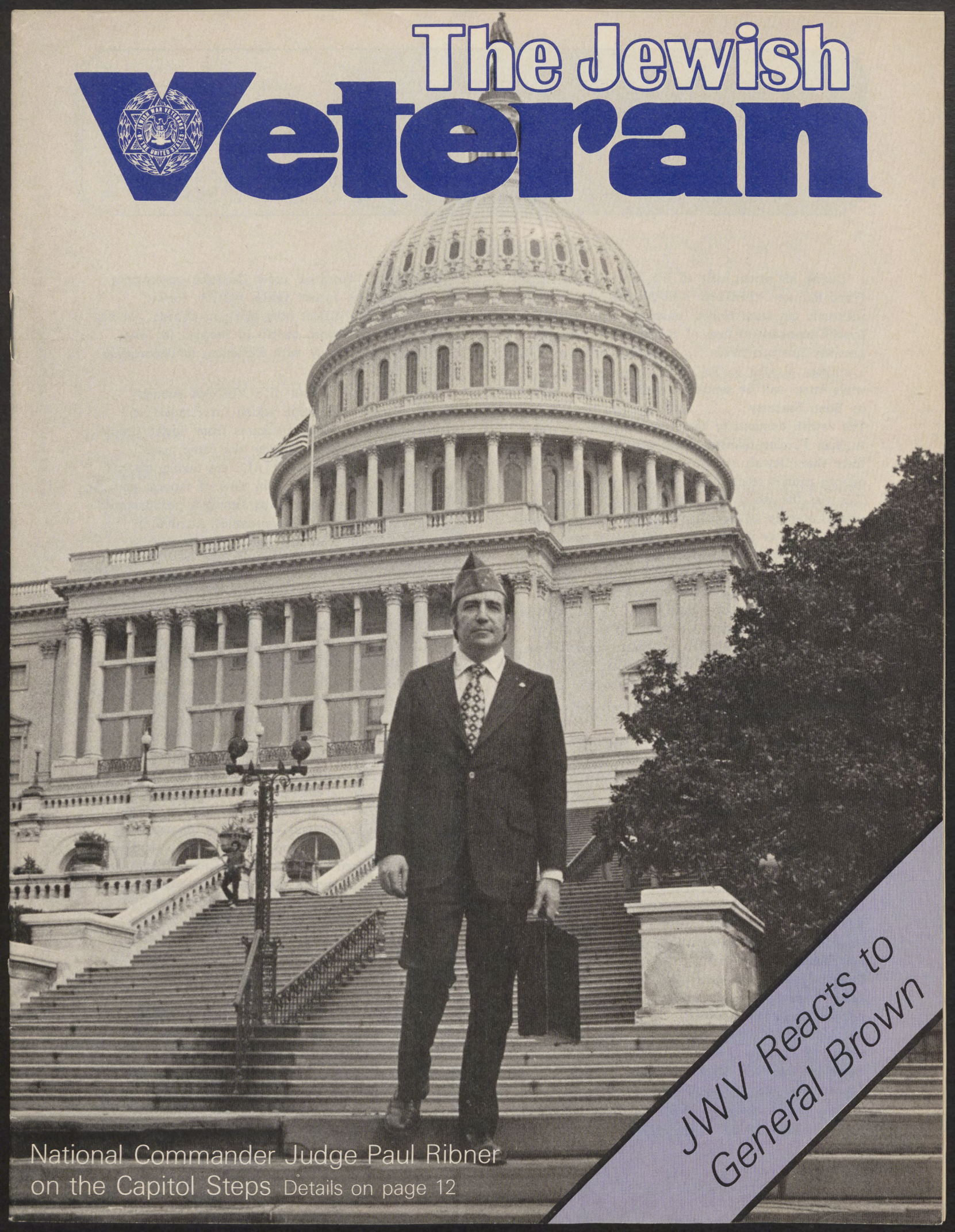

# news around the Jewish world

During his recent visit to U.S. and Canada, Israeli Prime Minister **YITZHAK RABIN** called for wider economic aid from North American Jews to strengthen Israel's economy in face of the country's pressing post-war financial needs . . . **BONN** will be sending a military attache to Tel Aviv in the near future, while Israel will be sending a senior military officer to its Bonn Embassy . . . Anti-Semitism in **BRAZIL**? The Jewish community there is concerned by Saudi Arabian Foreign Minister Omar Saqaff's statement there that "Jewish racist Zionism" is the reason Arab nations cannot reach a high level of development. This was the second time in 12 months Saqaff was greeted warmly by Brazilian President Ernesto Geisel . . . Recently inaugurated in Balassagyarmat, **HUNGARY**, near Czechoslovakian border, was a huge and imposing memorial to Jewish martyrs. The occasion marked the 30th anniversary of deportations.

Private funeral services held Sept. 13 for **HAROLD LIGHT**, former president of Union of Councils of Soviet Jewry. He was 58 . . . West German Free Democrat deputy **ERNST ACHENBACH**, leading figure in blocking German court prosecution of French-convicted Nazis, resigned from his key position in the Foreign Affairs Committee in the Bundestag . . . **GREEK** Cabinet official, P. Lambrias, assured a delegation of Jewish leaders recently that the government considered anti-Semitic articles (including newspaper reference to Henry Kissinger as "the German Jew Kissinger") anti-Greek and "harmful to the Greek nation" . . .

**MAX FISHER**, chairman of Board of Governors of the Jewish Agency, says he is convinced **PRESIDENT FORD** has "most friendly attitude to Israel." . . . A Tel Aviv District Court judge has ordered a kibbutz to pay IL 900 a month in alimony to a divorced wife of one of its members until she finds a new home. The kibbutzim contended that no one forces a member to leave after divorce. The Judge ruled, however, that the kibbutz, as a collective, is responsible for its members . . . The U.N. **GENERAL ASSEMBLY** voted 105-4 on a resolution inviting the Palestine Liberation Organization to participate in Assembly debate on Palestine issue. Voting against were U.S., Israel, Dominican Republic, Bolivia. Britain abstained. Among nations voting for the PLO were France, Italy, Jordan . . . Nazi-

hunter Simon Wiesenthal urges Canadian government to take measures against **IMRE FINTA**, former Hungarian police officer now living in Canada. He had commanded the Jewish ghetto in Szegged in 1944, and cooperated closely with Eichmann in deportation of Jews to Auschwitz.

More than 600 people of a **VIENNA** suburb signed a protest resolution asking for removal of transit camp for Jewish emigrants from Soviet Union. Government leaders are moving the camp again . . . Police in **EUROPEAN CAPITALS** are taking special precautions to protect Jews in view of reports that Arab terrorists are planning to kidnap a prominent Jew to use as hostage for release of Archbishop Hillarion Capucci who was charged in Israel with smuggling arms for El Fatah terrorists.

Special appeals conducted in synagogues throughout the U.S. and Canada during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kipur have produced a total of \$40 million in **ISRAEL BONDS**, the largest amount of bonds ever subscribed during a High Holiday period since the inception of the Bond program . . . Under a program not available during World War II and Korean GI Bills, the **VETERANS ADMINISTRATION** pays the cost of special tutoring that veterans and servicemen enrolled in college may need. The VA pays up to \$50 per month, not to exceed \$450, and not charged to the basic educational entitlement . . . **ED BLATT**, national chief of staff of the JWV left October 27 for Vietnam. He was invited by the Government of Vietnam to attend National Day ceremonies there . . . One of Israel's top diplomats, **EHUD AVRIEL**, has been appointed Consul-General to Chicago and is due to take up his post shortly. Officials say his appointment is the first of a series intended to boost the strength and status of Israel's representation to major American communities . . . Demonstrators in **PARIS**, shouting hostile remarks about French President Valery Giscard d'Estaing, protested French Middle East policies in front of the Elysee Palace recently. The demonstration was held by a group of young people calling themselves the Committee of Support for Israel.

Former U.S. Attorney General **RICHARD S. KLEIN-DIENST** is working for the Algerian government in the U.S. and getting \$12,000 per month in salary and expenses for his services, records at the U.S. State Department disclose, according to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.
